Week 1: Structures Activities Assigned/Planning Time

1. Paper Cup Structures

Build a tower or wall with paper cups.

Materials:

o Paper or plastic cups, any size, but all the same size Provide at least 20 cups for each person to use when at this station. Cups will be re-used each time a new group rotates through.



2. Playdough and Craft Sticks

What 2D and 3D shapes can you build with these materials?

Materials

- Playdough (homemade or store bought)
- o Craft sticks, plain or colored

Provide enough for a small group of students to use when at this station. Materials can be reused each time a new group rotates through.



3. Straws and Chenille Stems

Push chenille stems through the straws and to construct 2D or 3D shapes.

Materials:

- Straws
- Chenille stems
- Scissors

Provide about 20 chenille stems and 20 straws for each person to use when at this station. Materials can be re-used each time a new group rotates through.



4. Index Card Towers

Build a tower with index cards. Fold some in half and leave others flat. How high can you build before your structure collapses?

Materials

o 5"x7" index cards, any colors

Provide about 20 index cards for each person to use when at this station. Cards can be re-used each time a new group rotates through.



5. Paper Strip Sculptures

Fold paper strips to create different shapes. Use glue to hold your sculpture together.

Materials:

- 1 piece of cardstock or construction paper 9" x 11" for each student in the class to use as a base
- Construction paper cut into 1" x 11" strips in a variety of colors, enough for each student to make a sculpture
- Liquid glue and/or glue sticks
- A few pairs of scissors

Materials are glued down, so they cannot be re-used. Supply enough for each person in the class to make their own sculpture.
